

**CHARTING A COURSE FOR 2023** BRIDGE has published its 2019-2023 Strategic Plan, a five-year road map as it continues to grow as a leader, producer, operator and owner of affordable housing in the context of holistic communities. The plan focuses on six interrelated initiatives: Real Estate Development; Capital and Fund Development; Community Development and Resident Services & Evaluation; Internal Strengthening; Information Technology; and a new Innovation Lab, which will incubate, pilot and launch new initiatives that address issues such as cost-containment strategies and the need for moderate-income housing. Performance metrics include advancement of 9,000 units of housing, \$3.8 billion in project capital raised, and 25 community-serving assets planned or developed. Download the plan.
