If you have been accepted to and are currently planning to attend a public or private accredited college or university, for pursuit of a business program, including: accounting, marketing, finance, business administration, etc., then we encourage you to proceed with applying for the Kent Colwell Scholarship.

This scholarship is competitive. We regret that although the majority of applicants are qualified, not everyone who applies will receive an award.

## **Application Procedures**

#### APPLICATION DEADLINE:

- All application materials must be submitted by Sunday July 19, 2020 at 11:59 PM.
- Applications submitted past the due date for any reason will not be accepted. This includes, but is not limited to, late submissions due to technical issues, missing email attachments, files bounced back, or applications that are illegible or incomplete.

### **Financial Plan**

The *Kent Colwell Scholarship* offers funds through BRIDGE Housing that may have personal tax implications. We recommend that you consult with an accountant or tax professional to understand how this may affect your taxable gross income. See "Frequently Asked Question" #9 for more details.

#### **EXPENSES:**

- These scholarships and awards are designated for costs directly related to your educational pursuits such as tuition, books, school materials, a computer, mileage, parking permits or transit passes to/from school, class-time childcare, etc.
- Personal expenses are **not allowable scholarship expenses** and should not be included as part of your request. These include items such as food, meal plans, rent, utilities, fines/tickets, vehicle repair/purchase, personal electronics (TVs, phones, video game systems), furniture etc.
- We cannot list all allowable or disallowable expenses in this document. If you do not see your expenses on the lists above, please call the scholarship administrator for consultation. Any new expenses not listed on your approved educational budget (pg 5) **must be pre-approved** by the BRIDGE scholarships administrator.
- Please use your best judgement in keeping your expenses and expense reporting in-line with the intent of the scholarship program to support educational attainment for BRIDGE residents. If you have questions regarding a particular expense, please reach out to the scholarships administrator prior to spending funds.
- **Note:** You will be **required to report on expenses** (including submitting receipts) twice during the annual scholarship cycle. Failure to report expenses or to spend the scholarship funds in-line with the nature of the program may result in termination from the scholarship program.

- In this sample, the student has applied for Cal Grants for tuition assistance and put some money aside for transportation/ supplies. This sample is not an extensive summary of all costs that may be associated with your program.
- Note that a total Colwell scholarship or award falls between \$5,000 and \$10,000 per year for up to four years. Your Scholarship
  eligibility is not dependent on the amount you request from BRIDGE, so applications requesting less than the \$10,000 annual
  maximum will not be given priority or be deemed more competitive. You are encouraged to request an amount that would most help
  you offset the cost to you for eligible academic expenses.
- If your request exceeds this amount and you are chosen as a recipient, the most you can expect to receive would be \$10,000 annually.

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### 1. Description of Program

The Kent Colwell Scholarship assists residents in the pursuit of educational and career goals with the aim of enabling socioeconomic mobility. This program provides grants to residents of BRIDGE-affiliated affordable family properties. Funding for this program is provided by friends and associates of BRIDGE who have been involved with our work and believe in the importance of educational opportunity. Grants typically range from \$1,000 to \$6,000.

### 2. Who can apply?

The Kent Colwell Scholarship is open to current residents of BRIDGE-affiliated family properties.

- a. Applicants do not have to be the head of household, but must be at least 17 years of age, on the lease, and in good standing.
- b. This Scholarship is specific to residents pursuing programs in business, including post-secondary education, vocational classes and certificate programs in Accounting, Finance, Marketing, and Business Administration or individuals who are not currently attending school, but who have been accepted for admission in the Fall.
- c. Though the scholarship is available as a multi-year grant, applicants are eligible to receive this scholarship only one time. Eligible applicants will have received 3 years (or less) of funding from the Colwell scholarship in the past.

### 3. What is the application deadline?

COMPLETE applications must be received, or if mailed, post-marked by, July 19, 2020. Applications must include two (2) letters of recommendation to be considered. Refer to the checklist (pg 1) for a list of what constitutes a complete application. The deadline is the same for those who request translated applications.

## 4. My roommate has limited English skills but would like to apply. What can they do?

Residents with limited English skills may request an application in Spanish, Russian, Vietnamese, Chinese, Arabic or Farsi. Applications may be completed in the applicant's native language, and will be translated into English for evaluation purposes. Applicants who request and submit their application in their native language may also submit their progress reports in that language.

### 5. How will recipients be selected?

Recipients will be selected based on personal commitment, financial need, and a clear, realistic educational and financial plan. Applications will be reviewed and selected by a committee of BRIDGE staff and board members. Finalists may be interviewed. The Kent Colwell Scholarship is a competitive scholarship program. We regret that not everyone who applies will receive an award.

### 6. Can a family member who is not a BRIDGE resident apply for a grant?

No. The Kent Colwell Scholarship is only available to current residents (on the lease) of BRIDGE-affiliated family properties. (see question #2 for details)

### 7. How can the grants be used?

- a) Grants may be applied towards expenses that arise in the pursuit of educational objectives.
- b) These costs may include items such as tuition, books, educational equipment (such as computers), and certain transportation costs.
- c) They may not include: food, rent, or other personal items that are not directly related to attending school.
- d) See 'Financial Plan (pg 4) for more details regarding expenses and expense reporting.
- e) BRIDGE reserves the right to determine eligible and non-eligible expenses on a case-by-case basis.

### 8. If I receive a grant, does it count toward my income?

Applicants may apply for a "Scholarship" or an "Award".

- a) "Scholarships," have allowable expenses determined by the IRS, including:
  - Tuition and fees required for the enrollment or attendance of a student at an educational organization.
  - Fees, books, supplies, and equipment required for courses at an educational institution.
- b) "Awards" may be applied to cover additional costs, such as:
  - Transportation, childcare, and educational equipment not required for, but incurred during, courses of instruction.
  - These costs count as part of the recipient's gross income, and may be taxable.
- c) Please consult a tax professional for more information.

### 9. Will this grant affect my status as a BRIDGE resident?

Applicants living in properties financed through the Low-Income Tax Credit program should be aware that the full-time student status rule still holds: households cannot be comprised only of full-time students.

### 10. When will grants be distributed?

Funds will generally be distributed to recipients and/or educational institutions in two disbursements, with one check being mailed in time for each semester. After initial awards are released, the next set(s) of funds will not be released until the first progress report and receipts from the initial semester are received (See question #12).

### 11. If I receive a grant, do I have to report on my progress?

Yes. BRIDGE requires all recipients to submit biannual reports (every six months) that describe their educational progress and how grant funds are being used. After the initial round of funding, future funds will not be released until the bi-annual report is submitted.

### 12. What if my educational plans change?

We require biannual reports (every six months) from all scholarship recipients. Any change in your educational plans and funding needs should be reflected in this bi-annual report.

### 13. What if I move during the award period?

If you are a resident when the initial award is distributed, your award will not be affected if you move out. However, any funds not yet disbursed will be forfeited and you will not be eligible to apply in the future as a non-resident.

### 14. If I do not receive an award this year, can I apply in the future?

Yes. The Kent Colwell Scholarship will be available on an annual basis.

### 15. Can I apply for a multi-year award?

Although applicants should submit their entire educational plan, funding will only be provided for one year. Awardees may apply for a renewal of funds the following year, but there is no guarantee of future funding.

### 16. What else should I know about this program?

If awarded a grant, you may be asked to participate in an awardee and donor recognition event in 2020 or future program years.
